Couple these characteristics with good specific weight (78.4kg/hl) and later maturity (+1 days compared with Skyfall) and you have a resilient plant type which is ideal for growers both in the first and second wheat slots.

OWBM resistance and yield consistency over contrasting season complete this attractive package.

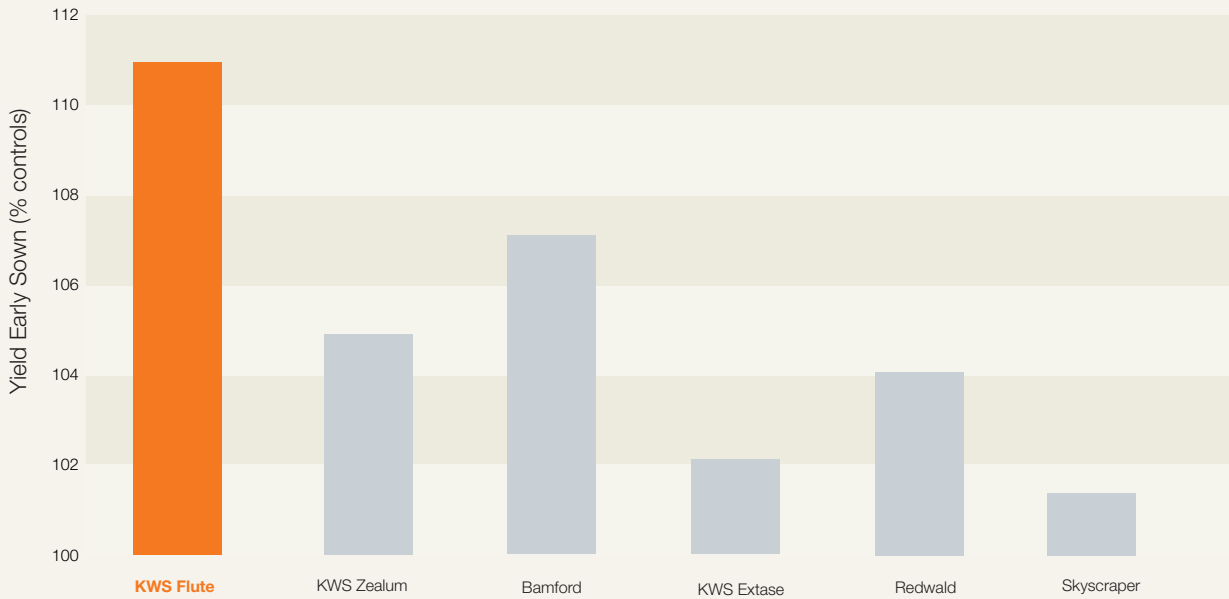

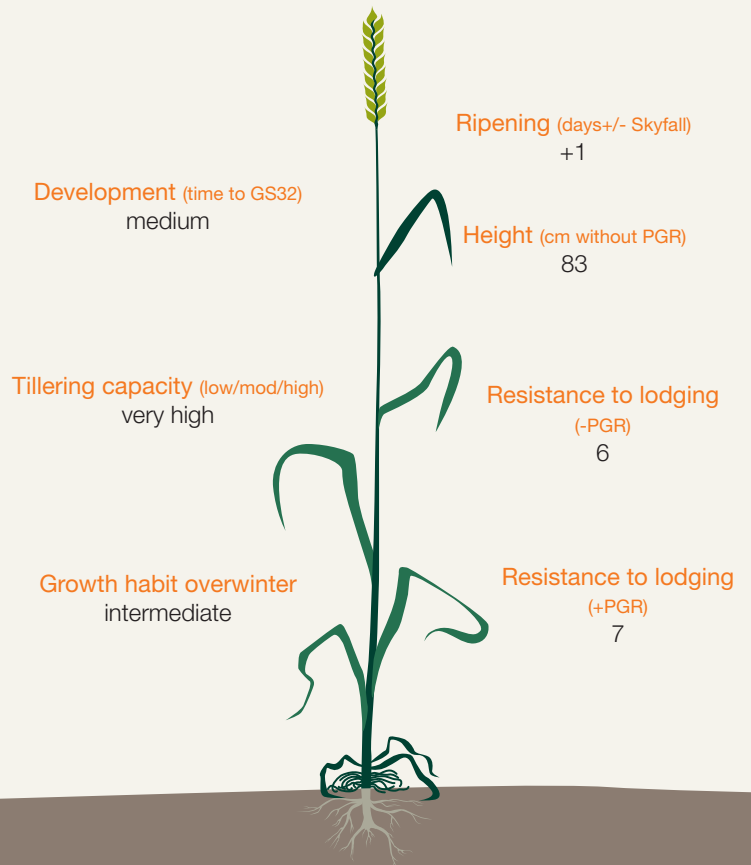

Thanks to its good grain characteristics over the past 3 contrasting seasons, KWS Flute is a new UKFM Group 3 wheat.

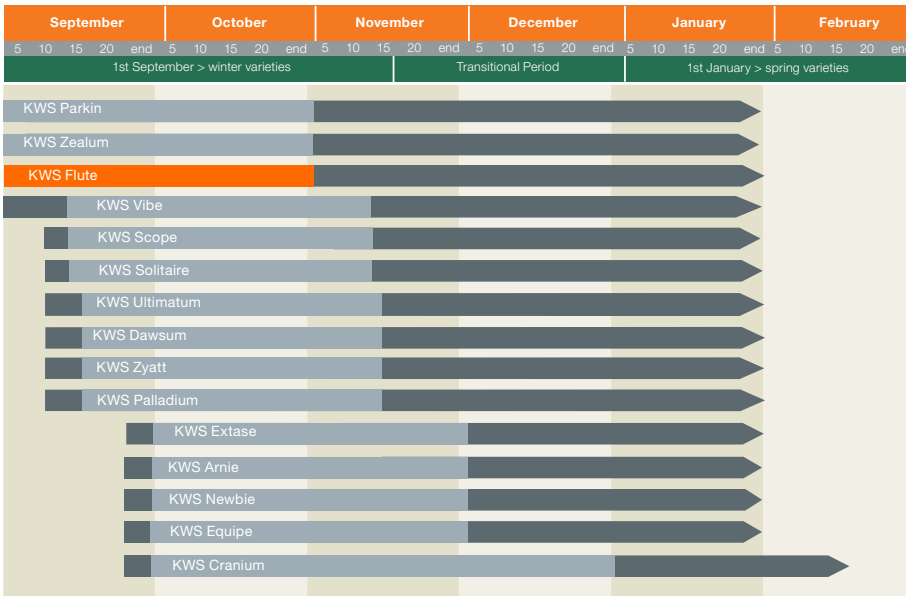

KWS FLUTE - Sowing for Peak Performance

80% of your crop's potential is locked in by the seed you buy and sow. While you can fine tune this with the correct nitrogen levels, using fungicides wisely to protect it from disease and paying attention to basic management principles, many attributes of your crop can't be changed. Therefore, it pays for you and your agronomist to make proactive choices before ordering a variety.

To get peak performance from KWS Flute we recommend drilling in the following time window:
